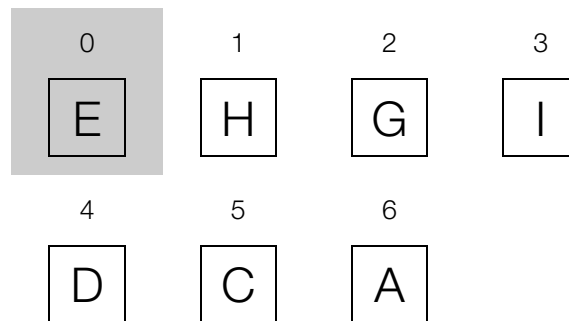

Rainbow Chan says: "It was a really beautiful, hot day and we just walked around the village together, looked at the different trees and the different flowers that they would usually pick off and walk around and sing these songs back in the traditional days." Therefore, one nice day during her visit, Rainbow and her relatives spent time outside.

Rainbow Chan says: "Ideally, I'll be able to pass it on to my children one day." Therefore, Rainbow hopes to teach the songs to the next generation.

Rainbow Chan says: "It is a lullaby, and it is about a grandmother who is trying to rock the baby to sleep. She talks about the different biscuits that she is going to bring over." Therefore, the song deals with a granny who is going to hand out cookies.

The speaker says: "I joined in Innsbruck because a friend of mine suggested it to me, and she suggested it so that I would get to know – kind of – the community in Innsbruck." Therefore, a friend introduced Diane to Ladies' Circle.

2

The speaker says: "They kind of take two minutes and kind of huddle together and then talk to each other and say what they are going to do." Therefore, the people need two minutes to decide what they are going to do.

Rachel says: "First of all, we worked managing a large nature reserve." Therefore, the first job Rachel and her husband did together was managing a nature reserve.

4

Rachel says: "[...] and later we settled on his parents' farm, where we help run the cattle and sheep farm and we also have a guest farm for tourists." Therefore, other than from animals, Rachel's family earns a living from a guest farm for tourists.

5

Rachel says: "Etosha is famous for being a very large park, very open, with large plains where you can see lots of plains animals." Therefore, the landscape near Rachel's place is very open.

Rachel says: "The staff that we employ on our guest farm are from the Haikom Bushmen people." Therefore, Bushmen work for Rachel.

Rachel says: "Many of the languages in Namibia, like the Bushmen languages, have click sounds in them. This makes them very unusual to hear, but also very difficult to learn." Therefore, click sounds are a special feature of the language of the area.

Rachel says: "The rain can start in November or December, but often only in January and it usually ends around March, April." Therefore, the wet season is over in March or April.

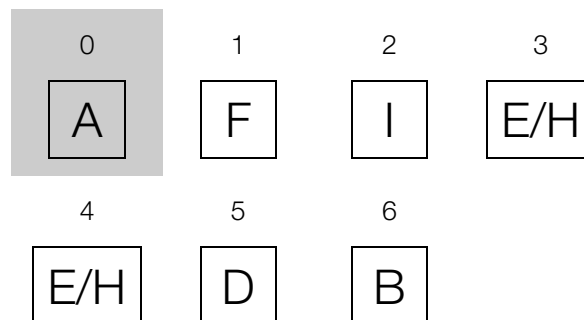
