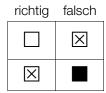



The speaker says: "That trip also stands out in my mind because I remember that my older sister, Jessie, had a goal that she wanted to see a moose on this trip." Another reason why Ellie therefore still thinks about this vacation is that a family member had a special aim for the journey.


