When Malia was born, Michelle and I were fortunate enough to spend a blissful three months

mostly at home with our baby girl. But then Michelle went back to (0) ____, and I returned to my schedule of teaching at the University of Chicago law school and (1) ____ in the state legislature. This meant that I would often be away in Springfield for three days at a time. Even when I was home in Chicago, I had papers to (2) ____ and briefs to write and evening meetings to attend.

As professionals, we were (3) ____ with the resources for things like reliable child (4) ____ and takeout when we were too exhausted to cook. Our jobs afforded us the kind of flexibility that many working families simply don't have. The ring finders

The fining mission
A man takes off his baseball glove in Central Park. His wedding ring slips (0) undetected and disappears into the grass. Hours pass before he notices that it's missing. A woman reacts in a fit of anger, (1) her engagement ring into the ocean. As it hits the water, pangs of regret settle in. A tourist visiting Canada (2) five sentimental rings to sanitize her hands (3) in a rental car. Later, when she steps out, they are sent sprawling into the snow, and she doesn't realize they're gone until she's on the flight back home.
Usually, stories of this variety almost always end in tears. Yet these three people found their lost rings, frantically googling some iteration of <i>I lost my wedding ring</i> and (4) a network of metal detectorists who help people (5) their misplaced jewelry. They had found their way to the Ring Finders, (6) that pairs these people with one of 430 sleuths stationed around the world.
According to the British insurance company Protect Your Bubble, 11 percent of people have lost their wedding rings in the past five years. Since wedding rings can cost upwards of \$6,000, losing them can be especially painful for couples, and (7) it also gives detectives adept in the art of finding lost rings a chance to intervene and be the hero.
Heartbroken couples who (8) the Ring Finders are presented with a search bar to enter their location, which leads to a list of nearby metal detectorists who cover that area. While the site's appeal for those who have lost their wedding rings is clear, there's much for the hunters

themselves to (9) ____. The Ring Finders service mainly operates on a pay-what-you-can system, (10) ____ most finders ask that they are at least (11) ____ their gas costs. Sending it back

If you're an Amazon shopper that returns a lot of orders, then watch out. You might get banned.

Some customers have been complaining of having their accounts shut (0) ____ without warning after returning items to the company on several different occasions, the Wall Street Journal reported this week. Even worse, in some cases they're banned from opening a new account.

While the company declines to mention in its returns policy that excessive returns can result (1) ____ being kicked off the shopping site, it does offer a broad warning that it (2) ____ the right to terminate any Amazon account.

The journal cites a number of cases, including (3) ___ of a New York City-based woman who (4) ___ thousands of dollars each year on a range of items from Amazon's online store. She said that on some occasions she has to (5) ___ for refunds on orders of clothes and shoes because they were damaged or different to (6) ___ she ordered. Earlier this month, Amazon closed her account without prior notification, telling her it had (7) ___ so because she "reported an unusual number of problems" with her orders.

In some cases, Amazon will tell the customer explicitly that excessive returns is the (8) ____ for the account's closure. The message reads: "We have closed this account because you have consistently returned a large number of your orders. While we expect the occasional problem with an order, we cannot continue to accept returns (9) ____ this rate."

Former Amazon managers told the journal that in the first instance, an algorithm flags up accounts exhibiting what may be suspicious behavior. Human evaluators then examine the case more closely before a decision is made on (10) ____ to close the account.

With this in (11) ____, it seems that excessive returns may, in some cases, be an indicator of underhand activities. The news outlet mentions how some people order items simply to write reviews — for which the writer will be compensated by a third party — before returning them, a practice the company is trying to stamp out.
