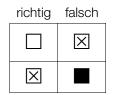

Ben says: "I grew up in New York City in the late 80s and in the 1990s and I'm very grateful to have grown up there because there was just so much energy there." Ben is therefore thankful that he spent his youth in a lively city.

Ben says: "And when it was time to go to sleep, it would be dark outside, but I <u>could see half of the city</u> from my window and there would be light everywhere." At bedtime, Ben therefore looked at a big part of New York.

Ben says: "For fun, I <u>enjoyed long evening walks through Madison Avenue or Central Park</u>, which are of course <u>very rich areas</u>, very well-kept areas and very pleasant to walk through." As a child, Ben therefore liked visiting nice parts of the city.

Ben says: "Or I would go to a certain donut shop that <u>doesn't exist anymore</u> or a pizza shop <u>that also</u> <u>doesn't exist anymore</u> and relax there." Some of the fast food places Ben used to visit therefore later closed down.

Ben says: "Or I would meet my friends to play basketball or soccer at a public park or we would <u>go bike</u> riding through Central Park or meet in a friend's home to play board games." Together with other young people, Ben therefore went cycling.

5

Ben says: "For instance, the school system and our teachers encouraged us to read novels and <u>we</u> <u>would also recommend novels to each other</u>. For instance *Catcher in the Rye* or the famous war book *Catch 22*. We would read Dostoevsky, the Brontë sisters, Ayn Rand, Victor Hugo, and <u>we'd talk about it</u> <u>then</u>." After working with certain books, Ben therefore discussed the books with others.

Ben says: "I think that was a true enrichment of our childhood and I also very much appreciate <u>the</u> research projects that we had to do in school. I enjoyed going to the library trying to <u>answer a question</u> that I had asked myself and then put my findings or what I'd discovered into a report to give in." Ben therefore felt motivated when he studied an interesting topic alone.

Ben says: "We also had to visit museums, um... for instance the Metropolitan Museum of Art, and for some reason I <u>really enjoyed the African art but not the Egyptian art</u>." On one school trip, Ben therefore liked only parts of what he saw.

Helen says: "What interested me most was his achievements as <u>an explorer</u>." Helen is therefore fascinated by Cook's success as an explorer.

1

Helen says: "I thought it must have taken <u>incredible courage</u> to do something like that." To go to unknown places, Cook therefore had to show incredible courage.

2

Helen says: "In his early days [...] he had travelled to <u>Canada</u> and he mapped the coast of Newfoundland." One of Cook's first journeys was therefore to Canada.

3

Helen says: "And even up to the 20th century his maps were <u>so accurate</u>, they were still used." People therefore worked with Cook's documents for a long time, because they were so accurate.

4

Helen says: "[...] he kept meticulous journals, but there is <u>nothing personal</u> in his journals about him. We don't know anything about his inner thoughts." In Cooks diaries you can therefore find nothing personal.

5

Helen says: "A lot of places bear his name, but they were given his name by <u>other people</u>." Many locations were therefore named after Cook by other people.

6

Helen says: "Another thing I admire about him is that he was very <u>respectful</u> of the indigenous people that they encountered along the way. He tried to befriend them and learn from them. He did not treat them as ignorant savages, which was quite <u>progressive</u> for the time that he lived in, the 18th century." Cook's behaviour toward native people was therefore really respectful and progressive.

7

Helen says: "It's quite sad, he could have lived after the second voyage. He could have retired and lived a <u>very peaceful, comfortable life</u> in London [...]." If Cook had stayed at home, he would therefore have had a very peaceful life.

8

Helen says: "When I was in <u>Australia</u> in 2009, I was delighted to find that the replica *Endeavour* was moored in Sydney Harbour." A continent Helen visited was therefore Australia.

9

Helen says: "So I was able to go on board and actually see the interior of the ship and appreciate how difficult it must have been to just exist for two, three years living in such cramped, close quarters. And not just the crew, but the <u>officers</u> as well. And I got to see Cook's cabin and then the officers' state room." On Cook's ship, Helen therefore saw that life was hard for ordinary sailors and officers.

Stephanie Han says: "She was a bookworm. She was a mom who, um, you know, sought out <u>intellectual</u> and <u>creative</u> things." Han's mother was therefore interested in activities that were intellectual and creative.

The interviewer says: "Your father taught you never to quit, which came in very handy when you're a writer seeking publication." Stephanie Han answers: "Yeah, so that was definitely <u>my father</u>." The most helpful advice about getting her books printed therefore came from her father.

Stephanie Han says: "So, when I was in 9th grade I went off to <u>boarding school</u> at Phillips Academy Andover, I was a straight-A student prior, I get to Andover, everybody was a straight-A student." The school Han changed to was therefore a boarding school.

Stephanie Han says: "So I came back for Thanksgiving, I did math <u>six</u> to seven <u>hours</u> a day with my father." Back home in fall, every day, Han therefore practiced math for at least six hours.



4 Activities in Golden Gate Park

The speaker says: "While birders delight in wandering the park, it's also a nice place to be a kid. Here's one <u>learning how to ride a bike</u>." In Golden Gate Park you can therefore watch children who are starting to practice using a bicycle.

The speaker says: "[...] a lot of people who live in San Francisco don't even know that, but there it is: nine holes that <u>welcome people of all skill levels</u> – unfussy and lovely." Only a few inhabitants of the city have therefore seen the golf course, which is for players from beginners to experts.

The speaker says: "But we're not here to play golf today. <u>We're targeting a different sport</u>. And just past the course's parking lot on 47th Avenue, just a couple of blocks from the beach we've arrived at our destination." That day the radio program therefore wants to find out more about another activity.

Luisa Cardoza says: "I'm here with Scott Bullard, Certified Archery Coach, and <u>we are about to shoot</u> <u>some arrows</u>." Luisa therefore meets Scott Bullard to do some training.

4

Luisa Cardoza says: "A lot of people are into archery these days, as the sport <u>has become so visible in</u> <u>the pop culture</u>. There is <u>Merida from the Disney movie Brave</u>, <u>Clint Barton and Oliver Queen from the</u> <u>comic books *Hawkeye* and *Green Arrow* and, of course, <u>Katniss</u>. The stakes are certainly not as high here in the park as they are in the <u>Hunger Games</u> [...]." Archery has therefore become very popular because people can see the sport in many books and films.</u>

Luisa Cardoza says: "Archery is a lot more physical than folks might think. During my lesson I <u>become</u> very aware of my core, which supports my upper back muscles, my neck and shoulder blades." While practicing with Scott Bullard, Luisa therefore notices parts of her body.

Luisa Cardoza says: "People have been <u>shooting arrows at targets here in Golden Gate Park for over 130</u> <u>years</u> and there is a wide variety of folks who use the range, from recreational shooters to seasoned bow hunters." In the park people therefore started to do this sport more than a century ago.

Luisa Cardoza says: "After a few more practice shots Bullard decides to shoot some arrows on his own, so <u>I take a walk around the range</u> to see who else is practicing." As Scott Bullard wants to train alone, Luisa therefore goes to explore the area.

Dorothy says: "We started coming out here because I got a target and stuff like that and it's <u>really, really</u> <u>fun to do</u>." Luisa therefore talks to a young girl who has a great time shooting.
